Membership Matters

Range Rules - At the recent committee meeting it was felt that the current system of managing the range when shooting is in progress was not working and needed revisiting. It was decided that at all times the club would use audible devices (bell or whistles on the range) when 2 or more people are present. Extra squeezy whistles are being purchased. The range rules will be updated shortly to reflect this.

Club Records - The club has not historically maintained and published a record of best scores achieved by club members, something a lot of clubs do. We would like to change this and publish record scores going forward as a club from 31st March 2025. This would be a simple list of the highest score achieved for a given recognised Archery GB round, by gender, age and bow style.

These will be published on the club's website so that the current record club score is visible. Should a club member then better that score they will have their name, score and date achieved added, replacing the previous record holder.

Publication of a person's name is allowed under the current Data Protection Laws. However, as we respect a person's right to privacy, should you not wish your name to appear against the record on our website, please 'opt out' by letting the club know before 20th March 2025. Please email gva_club_scores@outlook.com, simply state your name and club records with "opt out" in the subject line should you wish to opt out.

If you opt out your score and date achieved will still be published however the name will show as "withheld". This will be the arrangement for members over 18 years of age..

This disclaimer has been included in the amended membership form.

For those under 18 years of age, a parent or guardian will be required to 'opt in' should they wish their child's name to be published. This will be managed on a case-by-case basis by the clubs Records Officer.

The same principles will apply to internal club championships results starting with the winter championship at the end of march, details later.

Club Policies - The Committee are in the process of reviewing the club policies and procedures and as they are approved and adopted, they will be published on the website. Please check regularly, as these are what you have agreed to as members of the club.

Behaviour & Etiquette at external shoots was also raised at the last meeting, please remember to uphold these. As we are representing the club, this reflects on the club, if you practice good behaviour and etiquette at the club it then it is easier when at external events. It is also common courtesy to inform the Tournament organiser of the event if you are unable to attend or shoot, if everyone has checked in, the tournament can start rather than waiting for someone who isn't attending and then you can pick up your medals earlier!

Finally, many thanks to all for the members who completed the recent survey the committee will be analysing the results to understand how the membership wants the club to move forward, without losing its friendly reputation which we are proud of.

From March 9th we move from the Worcester to three weeks of Vegas rounds. Technically this means your arrows must be numbered and then shot in order. (I find this round is excellent for checking form as the target faces are also shot in order).

Following the Vegas rounds, on the 30th March we will be hosting the Clubs first handicap tournament to mark the end of the Winter/Indoor season.

This event was requested by members last year, so please support by coming along and see who our first champion will be. Shooting a Portsmouth round, once briefing at 10.30 is over, shooting will commence, only morning scores will count if you want to continue shooting in the afternoon.

You may not know it, but every time you submit a score from a target day, you get a handicap score, between 1-150, once you have submitted three scores you get a handicap score, which theoretically if added to your (actual) score on the day when shooting a round would give you a perfect score!

Therefore, regardless of bowstyles or experience everyone has a chance of winning. Please ensure you have submitted at least three recent target day scores by March 16^{th,} so we can work out your current official handicap (it's not always what it tells you on phone apps) to count towards the tournament. I am always happy to chat to anyone who would like more information about AGBs handicap system.
